As I ended mythird year of pastoring, it became evident that there were a few faithful grandparents bring their grandchildren to church each Sabbath. hard to register the children, a relationship grew between the parents and myself. I was able to



visit with some of them and pray for this outcome together.

With God's help all eight children attended Camp Wawona for the first time. Because of summer camp, and to the glory and honor of God, two children from the Coalinga Church decided to be baptized in the Fall of 2016. Today Scott and Kristine are helping in our church. Pictured is Kristine. who is in 8th grade and has grown spiritually. She helps in song service, leads out in offertory calls, and prayers. Even though her parents do not attend, she and her two sisters are ready every Sabbath. Their parents even drive them to church, praise the Lord! In Matthew 19:14 lesus said. "Let the little children come to me. and do not hinder them...". With God's help this year, our church is planning to send these same children back to camp and maybe more. It has become clear to me that the value of Camp Wawona outweighs the price, because Jesus asked us to bring the children to Him. Jesus and the Holy Spirit will take care of the rest.
