

Now we are ready to move forward with the first major building in the capital campaign, the Dining Hall. Ted and Dorothy Seybold pledged a piece of property to be sold for the new dining hall. We can't wait to get the dining hall built in honor of Ted and Dorothy. While the road is being built, we will be moving forward with the fundraising for the rest of the money for the dining hall and we hope to break ground in 2017. 
